## SECOND HARBOUR CROSSING STUDY

### PROGRESS SUMMARY

THE MINISTER FOR ROADS, HON P WHELAN HAS RELEASED A SUMMARY OF HOW YOUR LIFE-STYLE IS TO BE DESTROYED. THIS FASCINATING DOCUMENT IS AVAILABLE FREE FROM THE DMR STUDY TEAM'S HEADQUARTERS AT 142 DAY STREET, SYDNEY.

Here are just a few of the horrifying conclusions drawn after one year's study:

1. Optimum location for a new crossing is Greenwich-Birchgrove.
2. A crossing east of the Harbour Bridge would be too expensive.
3. Clear span and high level need location of bridge piers on land or shallow water.
4. Tunnels are not difficult to excavate and not all that expensive to complete.
5. Ventilating shafts are not a problem.
6. They can be HIDDEN IN BUILDINGS.
7. Ventilating fans WILL BE VERY NOISY.
8. Shell Co Tank Farm will have to be moved from Gore Cove because of safety risk.
9. If Shell isn't moved then re-location of the crossing will mean even more property resumption in Wollstonecraft.
10. Noise and vibration caused by traffic in the tunnel WILL ONLY BE SLIGHT!

11. Great noise and vibration WILL OCCUR AT TUNNEL MOUTHS AND AT VENTILATING SHAFTS.

12. DMR Tunnel/Bridge/Tunnel scheme is highly recommended.

13. It is to have ELEGANT towers on Mann's Pt, Greenwich and Long Nose Pt, Birchgrove.

14. The bridge section will be the longest of its type in the world, at 630 metres.

15. The design has already been developed.

16. The tunnel mouth will gobble up the hillside from Birchgrove Oval back to the junction of Rowntree and Cameron Streets.

17. It then travels 1.3 km to Rozelle at a grade of 0.7%.

18. The Rozelle mouth will gobble up the area from the junction of Reynolds and Mullens Streets to Victoria Road.

19. Tunnel/Bridge/Tunnel scheme offers an "optimum combination of ECONOMIC and ENVIRONMENTAL considerations".

20. This means that all that much won't be destroyed for not very much money.

21. Galdesville Bridge will be tolled.

22. In 1982 money, Tunnel/Bridge/Tunnel tolls (depending on whether existing bridges have their tolls included or increased) range from 47 cents to \$14.22.

23. If built by private enterprise and expenditure recouped from tolls then the off-peak toll will be \$14.22.

24. This toll will prevent traffic from using it.

25. This means that the State will have to subsidise the construction and maintenance costs.

26. Gladesville and Sydney Harbour Bridge tolls if introduced now and for 20 years after completing Tunnel/Bridge/Tunnel scheme at 60 cents one way, would finance such a subsidy.

27. This would allow new crossing toll to be 60 cents.

28. It doesn't add up!

29. Aerial route from Pyrmont to Rozelle must be built.

30. Johnston's Creek highway to Mascot will go ahead.

31. Both these must be built at the same time as new crossing.

32. 500 new jobs will be created by Tunnel/Bridge/Tunnel scheme over the ten years it will take to build.

33. The Study should continue and analyse in detail economic, environmental, social and transport/land-use issues.

34. The Full Tunnel scheme is also likely to be feasible.

35. The Bridge/Viaduct scheme is feasible.

36. The Transfield Bridge scheme is also feasible and will run along the edge of White Bay to Victoria Road.

37. Full Tunnel Scheme \$700m.

38. Bridge/Viaduct Scheme \$400m.

39. Transfield Bridge Scheme \$440m.

40. Tunnel/Bridge/Tunnel \$500m.

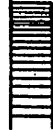
